## Introduction

Thakur Sen Negi Govt. College Reckong Peo is situated amidst the beautiful ranges of Himalayas and beneath the blessings of mountain peak Kinner Kailash. It is a pioneering institute for higher education at Reckong Peo District Kinnaur, which is one of the three tribal areas of Himachal Pradesh. The college came into being on 16th August 1994 with an objective to impart higher education to the people of this tribal area. The institute is named after a philanthropist and social worker Thakur Sen Negi, the son of the soil, who was the first Chief Secretary and three times elected speaker of Himachal Pradesh Vidhan Sabha. It was his dream that an institute of higher learning may be opened in this tribal district so that the students should not have to go Rampur, Shimla, Solan, Chandigarh or elsewhere for seeking higher education.

The institute has constantly endeavored to accomplish excellence in diverse areas such as academics, sports, NCC, NSS, cultural activities, Rovers & Rangers and other co-curricular activities. The vision of the college is to spearhead cutting edge education, implement advanced technology, sense of humanity and instill moral values and ethics among students besides, their all round development. The institution aims to develop varied faculties for learning which can draw out the best from students in terms of mind, body and spirit. The mission of the institution is VIDYA JANAM JYOTI 'Vidya' means knowledge, science, learning, scholarship and philosophy, 'JANAM' means consciousness, cognizance, knowing, understanding, becoming acquainted with proficiency and sacred knowledge, especially knowledge derived from meditation on the higher truth of religion and philosophy which teaches man how to understand his own nature and communion with the 'Supreme.' 'JYOTI' means light as the divine principle of life, source of intelligence, a type of freedom, bliss and victory.

The college is affiliated to HP University Shimla and accredited with 'B' grade by NAAC Bengaluru. Presently 13 subjects in Arts and 5 subjects in Science streams are being offered at undergraduate level. Students can also pursue B.Com degree. In addition to this there are Post Graduate courses in History and Political Science. Students may also opt for Self-financing courses like BCA and PGDCA and diploma/certificate courses in Tourism and Disaster Management. There is an IGNOU Study Centre for distant learners. The institute remains in the fore front in rendering services to the society by engaging students in service, betterment and welfare of the community. Cleanliness campaigns and rallies, various awareness campaigns, blood donation camps, collection of funds for relief and rescue works etc. are regular features of the college. Training camps for skill enhancement, workshops/seminars on communication and soft skills are organized at regular intervals.

- Our college hosted H.P.University Inter-college Cricket Championship (Shimla Zone) in which cricket teams of District Shimla, Mandi, Kullu and Kinnaur participated at Mini Sports stadium Kalpa w.e.f. 18<sup>th</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup> Oct. 2024. Our team played semi-final match.
- National Sports Day was observed on 29<sup>th</sup> Aug. 2025 to commemorate the birth anniversary of legendary National Hockey Hero Major Dhayan Chand. Volleyball matches of six teams including our college team were organized. In the thrilling final match, our team lost to Police team Kinaur by 22-25, 23-25.

### **Cultural Activities**

Cultural activities provide students with a platform to showcase their creativity and explore their cultural heritage.

- Many cultural activities were organized during the session. Folk dance, solo song, duet dance, skit & mime and group dance (Kinnauri & Pahari) were performed by the students during Republic & Independence Day celebration, H.P. State ST Craft Fair (Nov. 2024), Sports Day, District level Independence and Republic day celebrations, Annual Function, Freshers' party, Teachers Day celebration, farewell functions of different streams, Science Day celebration, NSS special camp and Freshers' party of girls' hostel. Besides, **our college also participated in solo song and Indian group song of H.P. University Youth Festival Group II held at GC Karsog w.e.f. 23<sup>rd</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup> Oct. 2024.**
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### **Scholarships**

The central and state government provide monetary help to various categories of students to fulfil their educational dreams and goals. During the session a total no. of 81 students (24 boys, 57 girls) applied for scholarship schemes under Indira Gandhi Utkrishth Chhatravriti Yojna, IRDP Scholarship Scheme. Kalpna Chawla Scholarship Plan, Post – Matric SC Scholarship Scheme, Post – matric ST Scholarship Scheme and OBC Scholarship Scheme. The amount of scholarship schemes shall be deposited online in the bank accounts of students. Mr. Kapoor Chand, Assistant Professor of Political Science did a commendable work as In-charge Scholarships.

### **College Library**

Library is an indispensable part of an educational institution. The college library has a collection of 10835 books on different subjects and 4209 reference books. It subscribes 06 daily newspapers and 5 magazines. It is connected with INFLIBNET and SOUL 2.0 software facilities. Books are issued to students regularly and a complete record of books issued/ returned is maintained. Students and visitors put their signature on the visitors' register daily. Students coming from economically weaker section of society are provided books for full academic session under Book Bank Scheme. During academic session 2024-2025, new furniture of Rs. 5 lakh was purchased, aluminium almirahs were installed in reading hall and reading facilities for students and staff were improved.

## **Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU)**

Our college is also a study centre of IGNOU since 1999. More than 32 programmes (degree and diplomas) are available with the study centre. The motive of the centre is to provide learning; knowledge and employability to the people of this tribal district; particularly to girls and to those who are unable to seek formal education because of working in government, public or private sectors or being self-employed. UG and PG Courses like B.A, B.Com and B.A in Tourism, M.A. in History, Hindi, English, Political Science, Sociology, Public Administration, Economics, Sanskrit and M.Com etc. are available for students.

### **Information and Technological Education & Language Lab**

The Institution provides information and technological education to all students. Class-wise/stream-wise time-table is displayed for the convenience of students. There are two computer labs with 43 computers, printers and scanners for students and teachers. An English Language Lab is also established in one of these labs in which basic training and knowledge are imparted to students to enhance communication and soft skills.

### **National Science Scheme (NSS)**

The motto of NSS is “Not Me but You”. The aim of NSS is to understand the community in which they work. NSS promotes national integration and sense of social responsibility. There is one unit of NSS. Under the able leadership and guidance of Dr. Sher Singh Negi, Assistant Professor of Economics cum – Programme Officer NSS, 100 volunteers were enrolled in NSS. The unit carried out various societal activities like cleanliness drive, awareness campaigns against drug addiction and swachhata abhiyan etc. during one day camps. They also acted as volunteer during Lok Sabha election on 1<sup>st</sup> June 2024 and district level functions like Red Cross Fair, Independence & Republic Day functions, state level tribal fair etc. During Swachhta hi Seva Campaign on 29<sup>th</sup> Sept., volunteers uprooted cannabis plants, bushes and hedges in the college, DC office, CJM court and Fire brigade premises, planted saplings at girls’ hostel like pinenut, devdar and robinia etc. They also cleaned the premises and removed polythene bags from college premises and surroundings during one day camps. They also participated in Mock Drill organized by District Disaster Management Authority at our college on 9<sup>th</sup> Oct. 2024, Constitution Day celebration on 26<sup>th</sup> Nov. and Drug Awareness Rally on World AIDS Day, i.e. on 1<sup>st</sup> Dec. 2024 and Republic Day parade at ITBP ground on 26<sup>th</sup> Jan.2024. **Seven Day Special Camp was organised w.e.f. 18<sup>th</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> Feb. 2024 during which various societal activities like cleanliness drives and awareness campaigns in adopted villages --- Khawangi and Kothi. A total number of 60 volunteers attended the special camp. Various societal, co-curricular and cultural activities were organized during this camp.**

### **Unnat Bharat Abhiyan(UBA)**

The institution is registered under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, an initiative of MHRD and follows its instructions and guidelines. We have adopted 5 villages of district Kinnaur during the academic

session 2024-2025 and many activities shall be carried out in these villages as per directions of MHRD. Mr. Narender Singh, A.P. Political Science is the Co-Ordinator of UBA.

### **Old Students Association (Alumni Association)**

The Old Students' Association (OSA) of the college is continuously working for the growth and development of institution. It is very co-operative and takes keen interest in various activities of the college. The association is registered under Society Act 2006. A general house of the association was convened on 26<sup>th</sup> Nov. 2024 and new executive body was constituted. Mr. Tanzin Nargu, Assistant Professor of Physical Education is the Member Secretary. A total number of 134 members are enrolled in OSA.

### **Disaster Management Cell**

The institution also has a very active and effective Disaster Management Cell. Mr. Dharam Kirti Negi, A.P. Geography is the Co-ordinator of the cell. In assistance with the District Disaster Management Authority, a mock drill on disaster management and fire safety with a student participation of 180 was carried out in the college on 9<sup>th</sup> Sept. 2024.

### **All India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE)**

. The college is registered under All India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE) The institutional details and data for the academic session 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 was prepared and submitted in Jan. 2025 through the web portal of AISHE. Mr. Inder Bhagat Negi, Assistant Professor of Computer Science, is the Nodal Officer of AISHE.

### **Rovers & Rangers**

Rovers and Rangers unit was constituted in 2008. There are 27 rovers (girls) and 25 rangers (boys) enrolled in this unit. The unit carried out many campaigns and drives like Drug Awareness Rally on 25<sup>th</sup> Nov. 2023. Mr. Bhagwan Singh Negi, Assistant Professor of Public Administration and Ms. Surbala, Assistant Professor of English are leaders of Rovers & Rangers unit.

### **Red-ribbon Club**

With the assistance of District AIDS Programme Officer Kinnaur, Red-ribbon club of college organized Reels Making Competition on 26<sup>th</sup> Aug.2023 in which our college bagged 2<sup>nd</sup> prize. As a nodal Officer Ms. Surbala, Assistant Professor of English, **received Best Red-ribbon club award during the state level World AIDS Day at hotel Peterhoff, Shimla** on 1<sup>st</sup> Dec.2023.

### **National Cadet Corps (NCC)**

'Unity and Discipline' is the motto of NCC and therefore it aims at developing character, good fellowship, discipline, a secular outlook, the spirit of adventure and ideals of selfless service among youth. It is needless to say that NCC also provides an environment conducive to motivate young Indians to join armed forces. One Army wing of NCC was established in our college during the academic session 2020-2021, presently it comprises of 55 cadets, 30 boys and 25 girls. NCC unit is working under 8HP BN NCC Rampur. Our cadets attended 10 day State NCC Camp at

Kalpa (Kiinaur) organized by HP BN NCC Rampur w.e.f. 24<sup>th</sup> July 2024. A team of NCC officials visited our institution on 9<sup>th</sup> Oct.2024 and interacted with our cadets. #### **Internal Quality Assurance cell (IQAC)**

IQAC of our college is working tirelessly to achieve academic excellence which is headed by Dr. Gian Chand, A.P. English. The institution is accredited with ‘B’ grade by NAAC Bangalore in May 2016. The college aims at improving the quality of teaching- learning, skill enhancement, all round development of students, use of ICT and modern tools of teaching – learning etc. For the accreditation of the 2<sup>nd</sup> cycle, the Annual Quality Assurance Reports (AQAR’s) of previous academic session, i.e. 2016-2017, 2017-2018, 2018-2019, 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 have been submitted by the college and the same have been approved by NAAC Bengaluru. AQAR’s from the session 2021-2022 onwards are being prepared and submitted under the newly designed binary system of NAAC.

## **University Grants Commission (UGC)**

The institution is included under 2(B) & 12(f) list of UGC and eligible to seek grants under different heads and schemes of University Grants Commission. During the academic session 2023-2024 no grants were received from UGC by the institution.

### **Self-financing Programmes**

Under Self-financing Programme BCA & PGDCA courses are being offered to the students. 40 seats each are allotted to these programmes. There are 30 subsidized seats in each course and 10 non-subsidized seats (in each) are offered. During the academic session 2024-2025, 26 seats in BCA and 18 seats in PGDCA were filled up. Mr. Inder Bhagat Negi, A.P. Computer Science, is the Co-ordinator of Self-financing courses.

### **Add-on Courses**

Under career oriented scheme of UGC, Add-on course on Travel & Tourism Management and Disaster Management are being run in the institution.

### **Girls' Hostel**

The institution has a girls' hostel with intake capacity of 60 students. It is equipped with modern facilities. 45 girls are residing in the hostel. A fresher's party was organized on 7<sup>th</sup> Sept. 2024 to welcome the new entrants. Many indoor and outdoor games like ludo, chess, carom, kabaddi, volleyball, badminton, long jump, high jump. 100 mtr. & 200 mtr. were organized during the session. Co-curricular activities like essay writing, slogan writing and declamation contests etc. were organized w.e.f. July 2024 to Feb. 2025. Our girls also actively participated in societal activities like cleanliness campaigns, awareness rallies, voluntary service etc. throughout this academic session. They also participated in co-curricular, cultural and sports activities organized by college, district administration or by any other social organization. Dr. Sidheshwari is the warden and Ms. Surbala is the co-warden of the hostel.
